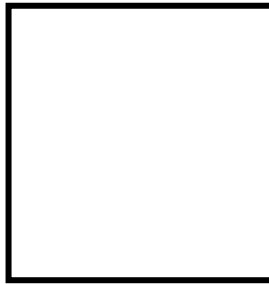
# AVICENNA

## *The Superstar Scientist of the Past!*

<b>A</b>	<b>When was he born?</b> Avicenna, also known as Ibnu Sina, was born in <b>(1)980 CE</b> in Afshana.
<b>B</b>	<b>Where did he grow up and go to school?</b> He grew up in Afshana, a village near Bukhara (in present-day <b>(2)Uzbekistan</b> ). He was largely <b>educated</b> at home by his father and other private tutors. By the age of 10, he was already well-versed in the Al-Quran and various sciences.
<b>C</b>	<b>Did he have any brothers and sisters?</b> Yes, Avicenna had a <b>(3)brother</b> named Al-Qasim.
<b>D</b>	<b>At what age did he leave school?</b> By 18, he had become a famous <b>(4)doctor</b> , and it's believed that he finished his formal studies by this age.
<b>E</b>	<b>Did he go to university?</b> He didn't attend a university as we understand them today and didn't formally <b>get a qualification</b> from such an institution. However, he was largely self-taught in many areas and also studied under well-known <b>(5)teachers</b> of his time. Despite not having <b>(6)formal</b> qualifications, his knowledge was so vast that he began to teach others while he was still young.
<b>F</b>	<b>How did he become famous?</b> Avicenna became famous as he is someone who knows a lot about many things, particularly in the fields of medicine and philosophy. His book, 'The Canon of Medicine', was used as a reference in <b>(7)Europe</b> and the Islamic world for several centuries.
<b>G</b>	<b>What did people call him?</b> In the West, he is known as Avicenna. In the Islamic world, he's known as Ibn Sina or Ibnu Sina.
<b>H</b>	<b>Where did he get a job?</b> He did a lot! He was a <b>(8)doctor</b> , an adviser, and he even helped manage some cities in the Persian empire.
